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Vide letter dated 20.02.2020, the Kendriya Vidyalay Sangathan (KVS), New Delhi has conveyed the permission to open an on-campus Kendriya Vidyalaya (KV) in phased manner (up to 8th standard in 1st Year) and to commence the classes from 1st April, 2020. A temporary accommodation of 14 rooms will be required urgently to run the KV till a permanent building is constructed. Since the time the institute shifted to its permanent campus, an on-campus school is running classes up to 10th standard. Due to inadequate infrastructure at one place, presently this on campus school is running classes in school premises, a residential flat and 07 shops given in the market complex.

It has been proposed to allow the on-campus school to create a few purely temporary removable structures within the school premises so as to get vacated shops in market complex for the proposed KV.. In their feasibility report, KVS Patna found these shops suitable for running the KV as of now. These structures will necessarily be temporary, and will have to be removed by the on-campus school at their own cost, as and when asked by IIT Patna. This was also agreed to by the Principal of on-campus school vide email dated 11th Feb. 2020.

Comments of MHRD: May be considered.

Realizing the critical necessity of using market complex as a temporary place for running the KV till a permanent structure is made, the BoG gave its approval to allow existing on campus school for creating a few purely temporary removable structures at their present place by suitable and necessary arrangements. All such temporary structures will have to be removed by the school at their own cost as and when asked by IIT Patna.

At the moment the Alumni Account at IIT Patna is an expense account in which the donations from Alumni and others are being received. Since the donations received from Alumni are to be used for their cause with their approvals, it is essential to have a separate corpus account for Alumni donations. However, interest from the Corpus Account may be used for expense of SAAR (Students' Association for Alumni Relations) events. To run the activities in an organized manner, a need was felt to have the Alumni Association or Chapter, opened and maintained by IIT Patna Alumni. Since most of the Alumni are based in Mumbai and Bengaluru, it will be good to have Alumni Chapter opened at Bengaluru.

In its 28th meeting held on 04th June, 2018 vide item no. 2018.28.07, approval to Earmark a few B Type flats for different purposes including Director's quota was accorded by the BoG. The flats in B and C type are almost fully occupied and allotment of D type flats is in process. To (i) accommodate a few positions whose on campus presence is essential in the interest of Institute, (ii) to optimally use oncampus accommodation which is highly sought after, and (iii) to address such situations as deemed contingent by the institute, it has been proposed to keep 04 nos. of C type and 06 nos. of D type flats at the disposal of Director, to be allotted as deemed fit by the institute. It is informed that due to pressure of providing accommodation to newly joined faculty members, 6 flats in the newly constructed C-type are reserved for faculty.

Comments of MHRD: May be considered.


Agreeing with the necessity of Director's quota as explained above, the Board approved allocating 10% of accommodation in each category, to be allotted by the Director in the interest of Institute.



The institute has to balance employing of outsourced and regular employees. This need has arisen for the following reasons:

- (a) funds under OH-31 has dwindled;
- (b) at the same time, the institute has steadily grown in size and number, thereby requiring larger security and outsourced manpower, incurring higher electricity bill, paying for expanded on-campus medical facility and so on;
- (c) newly started academic programs like B.Tech in Chemical Engineering Department which has small number of regular faculty members need visiting faculty to teach courses;
- (d) large scale construction activity as well as financial matters, ERP etc. need employing of external advisors/consultants.

It is repeated that expenses under (b), (c), and (d) come from OH-31 whose amount has steadily been inadequate in proportion to institute's needs.

The above facts demand that the institute distributes optimally the number of regular employees (whose salary comes from OH-36) and outsourced manpower (paid for from OH-31) under all categories, viz., group A, B and C.

Comments of MHRD: Institute may review the status and plan the expenditure within the budget allocated to the Institute and available IRG.

Board consented to the above views and advised to act accordingly.
